We learned from Mr. I that you can't just measure with one inch but if you put them together you can measure most anything. This is a lot like the things we do in life – when we work together we can get things done. Well, speaking of getting things done, we have read the books Ibis: A True Whale Story and The Invisible Storybook. We have been singing the songs "I Got Music In Me", "Here It Is" and of course an all time favorite "The Itsy Bitsy Spider". Speaking of books, we put together a new class book entitled Our Initials. We learned our initials and then each student drew a self-portrait to include in the book. Remember that your child should now know the letters N, n, and the /n/ sound.

This week in math class we worked on comparison words, comparing groups, comparing numbers and understanding equal groups. We worked on separating one group into two equal groups. In all of these activities we were using the numbers 0-1-2-3-2+5-6-7-8-9-10 and these become very difficult skills if your child does not yet know his numbers 0-10. PLEASE help your child if he/she doesn't know these numbers. Over fall break is a good time to catch up on this skill! Many students still need to work on their counting as well!!
